Drinks

Boskone

At the Boskone Science Fiction Convention in Andover MA, 1971, Ray led a sci fi drinks panel.

The scientist Russell Seitz contributed a batch of pure esters: cinnamon, clove, rosemary, which was added along with vodka.

Ray, who had a collection of interesting chemicals (as well as special recipes such as the pangalactic gargleblaster, the liquid helium zonk, and the pickled herring cocktail), contributed fluorescein and other ingredients. All incandescent lights were switched off and a black light turned on. Dry ice was quickly added to some of the drinks, which bubbled and frothed and shone in the darkness with an eerie day-glo green. Powdered milk, mixed into delicious rum drinks, gave off a ghostly yellow gleam. Vitamin B2 shone bright orange and Quinine was a lovely blue.

The panelists compared different flavors, and passed around some (Hey, they drank most of it!) to the audience.

After the formal tasting, among the ghostly lights Ray told some of us about the hopes of the Dartmouth participants. His description of things to come was true sci fi!

Here are a few pages from his plans for Boskone, which included bringing, among other things: apple juice, lime juice, orange bitters, rum, triple sec, vermouth, lemon, fluorescein, dry ice, screwdriver, hammer and hatchet. The beverages were served under Black Light.
